

What is Reading Eggspress?

Reading Eggspress is a web-based learning programme that integrates home and school learning via the internet. Reading Eggspress is a unique online world where children learn to read. It supports each child's learning by offering individual, one-on-one lessons that allow children to progress at their own rate.

Children love working and playing on the computer and the Reading Eggspress programme is all about bringing out the best in each child. Reading Eggspress provides instant feedback on student's performance, maintains a high level of motivation and offers teachers the opportunity to address children's learning strengths and next steps.

Why is Freemans Bay School using Reading Eggspress?

- Reading Eggspress supports each child's learning by offering individual, one-on-one lessons. These online lessons allow your child to progress at their own rate.
- It is based on the most up-to-date research on how children learn to read.
- The programme is completely interactive to keep children on task.
- Children want to come back because they are having fun as they learn.
- When children start the programme, they can complete a placement quiz to ensure they are starting at the correct reading level.
- The Reading Eggspress programme has an enormous range of learning resources, lessons, motivational games, e-books and a comprehensive reporting system that together create a unique learning environment.

How can I help my child with their reading using Reading Eggspress?

- Talk about their reading Ask your child what they are reading and talk about their ideas: What is the 'picture' they have of particular characters? Are there people like that in your family or whānau? What do they want to find out from the book? What are the important messages? What else do they need to know to understand the story or topic?
- Read Together Sit with your child when they are reading one of the Reading Eggs Books. Listen to them as they read the story aloud.
- Visit the online library in Reading Eggs. Help your child choose books they're interested in (about hobbies, interests or who they are and where they come from) or encourage them to get books out that are about what they are studying at school.
- Expand their vocabulary. Ask your child if they have come across any words that they are unsure about. Encourage them to look them up in a dictionary or ask family/whānau about the meaning and origin.

Reading Eggspress

Lessons: The Reading Eggspress Comprehension program contains 220 lessons from year 1 to upper year 6 that use a balance of literature and nonfiction texts.

The lessons are organised in a systematic and progressive format with a sequence of 5-lesson maps.

The program focuses on literal, inferential and critical reading comprehension questions for skill building and metacognitive understanding.

The questions address key areas in comprehension, such as the main idea and details; compare and contrast; making connections; sequencing events; cause and effect.

Students can work through these 10 lessons in any order. Once all lessons are completed, they move to the next lesson set.

The program includes a variety of instructional strategies including visual memory, definitions, word families, word sorts and proofreading with differentiated word lists.



Stadium - Compete in real time against students from around the country and around the world. The exciting head-to-head contest will test skills in one of four areas — spelling, vocabulary, usage and grammar.

The Reading Eggspress Library has more than 2000 reading levelled and Lexile levelled books for reading ages

5 – 12+ years. The wide range of library titles includes illustrated chapter books, full colour nonfiction books and a range of classics.

Shorter, easier books, include a quiz at the end of the title, to ensure comprehension of the text. These early titles have a 5 or 10 question quiz, which, when completed, earns the students Golden Eggs and Trading Cards.

The chapter books in the library have a 6question quiz presented at the end of each chapter. Completing chapter quizzes earns students Golden Eggs, with Trading Cards awarded when a student has completed every chapter and shown comprehension of each title.

The Writing Press – Learn the purpose of different text types with highly detailed descriptions, examples and tips on how to compose them. Includes guides to poetry, narrative, discussion, explanation and many more.

Lessons Reports:

The comprehension lessons include a 16-question quiz at the end of each lesson. Every time your child completes the quiz you will receive a detailed report. This will provide you with much needed information about your child's progress in using a wide range of comprehension strategies. You will also be able to see how many library books your child has read, the date read, the type of book, word length and their quiz scores. These results will provide you with a clear overview of the progress your child is making, their reading age and quiz average.
