#### WALKING SCHOOL BUS

We are starting up our Walking School Buses next week. This involves parents walking a group of students to school using a designated route and time.

**Nelson St and Cook St Bus:** Starts at the corner of Cook and Nelson St (53 Cook St) and travels along Nelson St to Union St and then down Wellington St to School.

The "bus" begins at 8.20am on Tuesdays and at 8.10am on Friday mornings.

**Franklin St Bus:** Starts at the Gunson St and England St corner, and travels along England St, crosses Franklin St and goes down Wellington St to School. *Due to road works, the route will cross opposite Napier St, and walk Napier St to school until it is safer to cross by Wellington St.* 

The "bus" begins at 8.20am.

If you want to join a bus, you need to sign up. Students sign a pledge of Good Behaviour and their parents sign a consent form.

We are wanting to have more parents help, and have them running every day of the week if possible. At present the "buses" run only going to school in the mornings.

### DIGITAL LEARNING 2018

#### **READING EGGS, AND MATHLETICS**

Reading Eggs and Mathletics are online learning games that use play and practice as the way to encourage students to enjoy and improve their spelling and number skills. These programs provide instant feedback on each student's performance, maintain a high level of motivation, and offer teachers the opportunity to address a child's learning strengths and needs.

Students who were with us last year will continue to use the same username and password. Information about these programs is available under the Digital Learning Tab on the school website or click <u>here</u>.

We will also be running some parent sessions to help you get the most of out of these programs later in Term 1.

Your child's teacher is in the process of setting each child up for 2018. However, if by the end of Week 3 (23rd February) your child is having trouble logging into either Reading Eggs, Reading Eggspress or Mathletics, please let your child's teacher know so they can ensure they have been set up correctly.

#### DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP AND CYBERSAFETY

We are reviewing the school's Digital Citizenship and Cybersafety processes at the moment. However, teachers always remind students how to keep safe online and appropriate behaviour for online activities, both at school and at home.

From a school perspective we will be focused on reminding them that:

- All electronic devices have to be handed in at the office at the beginning of the school day and collected at 3pm (except if you are in Whānau Wai and have permission to bring your own device to school)
- Students can only be on the Internet if the teacher has given them permission and are actively supervising them (the teacher needs to be nearby).
- If students see someone breaking our agreements, students should let the teacher know.
- Students should not tell anyone their passwords.
- Students should only log into their own online account. They are not allowed to log into the account of another student.
- If they feel unsafe on the internet, students are to stop what they are doing and tell a teacher or other adult straight away.

#### BYOLD

BYOLD "Bring Your Own Learning Device" (BYOLD) continues to be an option for those students in Whānau Wai. If you wish for your child to bring a digital device to school, you and your child need to sign the permission form and return it to your child's teacher. The form is available <u>here</u>.



#### **MICROSOFT 365**

All students at our school have a Microsoft 365 login which they use to access work in their online drive. Teachers use Microsoft 365 in different ways depending on the year level and skill set of the students.

Each student's "My Learning Journey 2018' is accessed via Microsoft 365. As the term progresses, it is a good idea to sit down with your child and access their "My Learning Journey" to discuss their goals this term. We have made a few changes to try and make it a little easier for students to use. You can find more information about My Learning Journey on our Assessment and Reporting to Parents on the school website. We usually run one information session each term so parents can learn more about 'My Learning Journey', so keep an eye out for more information.

### Music News

The Music programme at Freeman's Bay School follows the NZ Curriculum with each class having two terms of specialist lessons. The music room is well-resourced with class sets of recorders and ukuleles, as well as numerous percussion instruments, marimbas and keyboards.

There are 2 choirs (Years 3-4, and Years 5-6), a School Orchestra and a Rock Band which take part in school and city events each year.

#### Specialist Music Lessons at School:

At Freemans Bay School we have Specialist Music teachers come into the school and provide tutoring in guitar, keyboard, drums, junior percussion groups, and other instruments when sufficient students enrol for these. Parents pay for these lessons.

### Whānau Wai



Our class made a korowai-cloak. The goal was to construct a class korowaicloak which will display what we value in our class. The process was to be one of working cooperatively to create the cloak. Negotiating a caring classroom environment in this way reinforces the Māori concept of ako, "The promotion of effective and reciprocal teaching and learning."

Wai 1, 2, 3 are participating in a variety of Stem Challenges: these are hands-on problem

solving Technology Challenges. Students work as a team using simple materials. The Challenges link to New Zealand's

technology, science and mathematics curriculum.

Wai 1 students made Marshmallow Catapults. Working as a team, they had to build a catapult out of; popsicle sticks, plastic cups, rubber bands and a spoon.

The aim was to launch a marshmallow as far as possible.
